

Stamp Camp To Go

Flight of the Butterfly Pop-Up Card



This card has a fun pop-up mechanism that you make with just a few cuts!

Supplies

- **Stamps:** Flight of the Butterfly
- **Ink:** Cameo Coral, Certainly Celery, So Saffron Inks,
- **Pap:** Cameo Coral, So Saffron, Certainly Celery, Whisper White card stock,
- **Accessories:** Bigz XL Top Note Die and Little Leaves Sizzlet, Big Shot, Corner Punch, ¼ Circle Punch, Flower Punch

Prepping your card

1. Cut 3 sets of leaves using the Big Shot and Little Leaves Sizzlet
2. Stamp your images on the DSP and Whisper White sheet of card stock provided.
3. Cut out your images and set them aside.



Dimensions & Quantities:

This card uses the following cardstock dimensions:

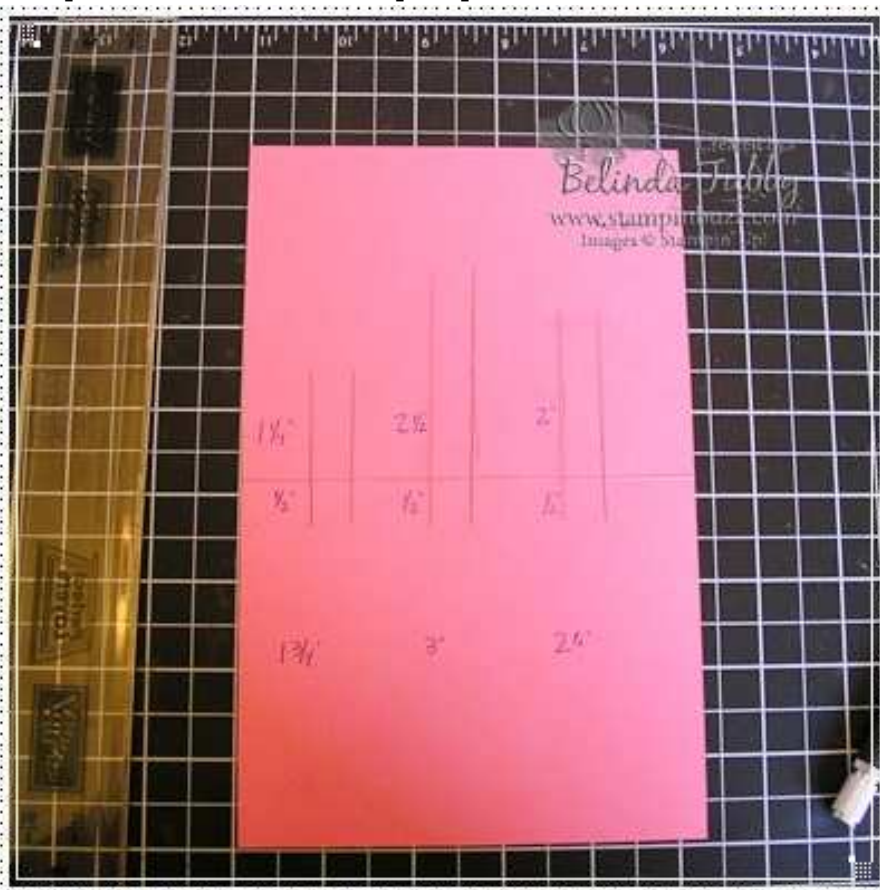
- So Saffron card base (5 ½" x 8 ½" folded in half)
- Raspberry Tart DSP (5 ¼" x 8 ¼")
- Cameo Coral CS: 5 ½" x 4 ¼" for Top Note Piece
- Cameo Coral CS: 3 ¼" x 3 ¾"
- Whisper White CS: 3" x 3 ½"
- Whisper White for
- Celery, Coral, Saffron for punching and sizzlets

Step 2: Decorate Card Front



Cut a Top note piece from the Cameo Coral card stock. Cut the Top Note piece in half so that you can layer it behind your main image. Stamp image on Whisper White Card stock and mount on Certainly Celery layer. Add a punched corner (emboss your paper before punching for a nice look) Embellish with leaves and flowers.

Step 2: Assemble Pop Up



You will use your Designer Paper for this step. Fold your paper in half. Cut three slits in varied sizes in your paper. Each slit should extend a half inch below your fold line. The easiest way to do this is to Mark your lengths on a ruler and use as a guide with a pencil or Exacto knife. These do not have to be exact dimensions. Just vary the lengths. They must be even on both sides and must extend the same length below your fold line.



As you begin to fold it over it will look like this.



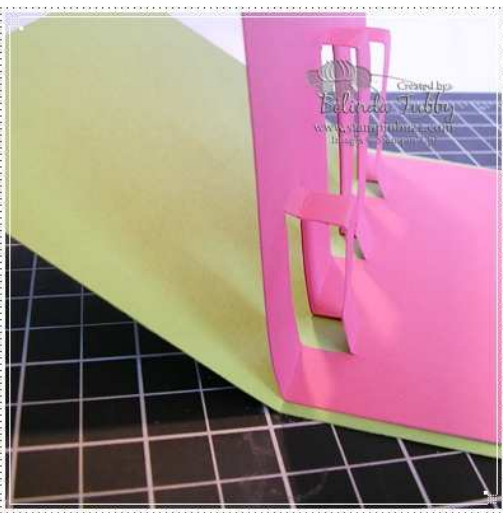
Continue folding your card in half, carefully allowing the slits to roll until they begin to pull from the bottom piece. As you close the card, they should naturally crease $\frac{1}{2}$ inch from the top of the slit. Try using a bone folder or pen (through the opening from the back) to gently push the slit till it tugs from the bottom. This is where your fold should be and it should be equal to the length that extends below your fold line.



Your card should look like this



Carefully add tape all over the area that is not cut. Don't get any tape on the cut area.



Line up the folds of your DSP with your card base and carefully adhere.



Your piece should look like this.



Decorate the inside of your card using your stamped pieces. Cut down punched flowers to make leaves for your flowers.
